

Do you “wonder” after the beast?

You might be as amazed as we were when we found some deeper meaning to the word that, for so long, only seemed like a static impersonal way that one would view the beast of Revelation 13:3 which reads:

“And I saw one of his heads, as it were, wounded to death; and his deadly wound was healed: and all the world wondered after the beast.”

Here's the Jay P. Green Interlinear so-called modern “literal” reading of the Greek (just for the record):

“And I saw one of his heads, as having been slain to death, and its deadly wound was healed, and all the earth marvelled after the beast.”

Now, most of us here already understand that the deadly wound was struck in 1798 by Napoleon through his general Berthier when militarily deposing the Pope and dragging him into exile where that Pope then died. Napoleon (a super high-ranking freemason) had clearly done this to quell dissent of the masses of the day, by artificially killing the papal power, hoping by this deception to subtly convince the world that the evil Romish church was no longer alive, and with evils still prevailing, could not therefore have been the cause of the world's tyrannies as the “conspiracy theorists” of that time were claiming. Hitler and Mussolini then re-stated the Papacy in 1929 after the papacy was no longer being blamed so heavily, which fulfilled the deadly wound being healed.

But now let's look at the actual Greek word (Strong's #G2296) which in some rare old books (and even modern ones) has some very interesting forms and definitions. Let's look at some of the examples in the “Liddel-Scott-Jones Greek lexicon:

To wonder, marvel, honour, admire, worship. In one form it means to honor “technically, as of the attendance of small birds on the owl” Yikes!

But there's more. Forms of this word also means:

“to show respect to a person; to comply with their request; to receive proper marks of respect; to wonder at men in power supposing”

“To wonder at men in power”? “To receive proper marks of respect”???? WOW!!!

Need we say any more folks? ...or does this speak for itself?

Do you still “wonder” after the beast? ...or have you come out from among them, loving your Father and loved ones as we do?
